++Legislative News++

I have received several inquiries about the Amateur Radio Protection Act (https://www.congress.gov/bill/118th-congress/house-bill/4006), which has the full title of "To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to prohibit the application of certain private land use restrictions to amateur station antennas, and for other purposes". The Senate has a companion bill of the same name, (https://www.congress.gov/bill/118th-congress/senate-bill/3690/text), and virtually identical wording. I recommend reading over the bill and if you feel that it is something that would benefit amateur radio operators, write your representative and encourage them to co-sponsor it. Next Generation of Amateur Radio. As you may have read in QST, the League is focusing attention of the next generation – mostly by influencing teachers and STEM education curriculum to incorporate radio fundamentals into middle and high schools across the US. In fact, over \$2 million in new funding grants have been set aside by the Amateur Radio Digital Communications (ARDC) and The ARRL Foundation to kick start a three-year commitment to support scholarships for radio amateurs, radio technology for classroom teachers, and amateur radio club grants. ARRL encourages clubs to revitalize this critical aspect of their role by applying for funding to support programs in one of the available categories, including ham skills development, STEAM learning and education, or club station improvement, among others. This transformational program will launch in the Spring of 2024. +++ARRL/ARES MOU with VDEM Update+++

After almost two years of work between the Virginia Section of the ARRL, the Virginia Dept. of Emergency Management (VDEM), the Virginia Attorney General's (VA AG) Office, and ARRL HQ, we have a new Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in the process of being signed. With this revision we can begin the process of updating the ARES Virginia Standard Operating Procedure, and the timing on this couldn't be better. The updates to the National ARES training program are occurring at the same time, so this will be the first time that all documents are synchronized.

+++Simulated Emergency Test (SET)+++

The ARRL has made a substantial change to the SET planning and execution that recognizes that many Sections may have real-world events occurring during the Fall window, and now allows for the scheduling and execution of the SET throughout the year. The annual SET report will remain in the September QST.
